About the Museum

The Richardson-Bates House was built in two stages as a private residence for Maxwell Richardson, a local attorney, real estate broker and two-term mayor of Oswego. The house was completed in 1889 and was a home to four generations of the Richardson family. Today, the Richardson-Bates House is owned and operated by the Oswego County Historical Society and remains one of the most intact house museums in New York State. The house also features an extensive archival collection and exhibit space documenting the history of Oswego County.

Responsibilities

- Collaborate with the museum assistant to come up with video topics promoting the history and programs offered by OCHS and the museum
- Research, write, and film short (2 to 5 minutes) documentary style videos
- Create aesthetically pleasing looping videos/gifs intended to use for marketing of the museum and organization

Qualifications

- Junior or Senior class standing at SUNY Oswego; Cinema & Screen Studies,
 Broadcasting, Creative Writing, or other relevant majors preferred
- Be open to critique and edit requests from staff and board members
- Willingness to work independently and with a small team
- Available to work 10 hours per week, for a total of 120 hours
